ABOUT PUGWASH

The mission of the Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs is to bring scientific insight and reason to bear on the catastrophic threat posed to humanity by nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction. It was in recognition of it mission to "diminish the part played by nuclear arms in international politics and, in the longer run, to eliminate such arms" that Pugwash and its co-founder, Sir Joseph Rotblat, were awarded the 1995 Nobel Peace Prize.

Drawing its inspiration from the Russell-Einstein Manifesto of 1955, which urged leaders of the world to "think in a new way," to "remember their humanity" and to find peaceful means for the settlement of all matters of dispute between them", Pugwash focuses on those problems that lie at the intersection of science and world affairs. Pugwash's main goals remain to seek the elimination of all weapons of mass destruction, to promote dialogue and reciprocal understanding in order to reduce the risks of war, especially in areas where weapons of mass destruction are present and may be used, and to discuss new scientific and technological developments that may bring more instability and heighten the risk of conflicts.
